



Recognition and accomplishments of members and leaders of the Chase County 4-H program once again were highlighted at annual 4-H Achievement Night program.

Leaders and 4-H members were presented certificates and awards on Nov. 18 at the 4-H exhibit building in Imperial.

Each year, Outstanding Exhibit Hall Awards are given to individuals who excel in different project areas. These awards are based on the individual's presentation on the county level, competing in a judging event and exhibiting at the county fair in the area of the award.

This year's recipient of the Outstanding 4-H project was Regan Gittlein. Rylee Christensen received the Outstanding Foods Award and Blair Hartman was the recipient of the Outstanding Home Environment Award. The Junior Overall FCS Award went to Jessica Hartman.

The trophies for the family and consumer science areas are sponsored 21st Century Equipment, Hill's Family Foods, Prior's and Sew Forth and Johnson's Publications.

Livestock awards were presented in the three areas which included herdsmanship, round robin and the carcass contest.

The Silver Spurs Club took home the honor for sheep herdsmanship, Dreamchasers received the beef herdsmanship, while the Silver Spurs were awarded the swine herdsmanship honors.

These clubs each received a cash incentive along with a certificate of achievement for their efforts.

demonstrate life skills as capable, caring, confident and competent kids of character, thus contributing to the improvement of themselves, their family, club, community and world.

This year the Silver Spurs 4-H Club, Dreamchasers 4-H Club, and the Chase County All Stars 4-H Club were recognized as Nebraska 4-H Clubs of Excellence.

The Nebraska 4-H Diamond Clover Program is designed to encourage 4-H youths to engage in a variety of projects and activities that will enable members to acquire the life skills and necessary to lead successful lives as competent, caring and contributing citizens. The program's overall goal is to provide 4-H members a rich and diverse learning experience.

Each year the 4-H Council recognizes supporters of the 4-H program by selecting recipients for the Alumni Award and also the Friends of 4-H Award.

This year's Alumni Award was presented to Julie Rigel. After helping her older sister and brother with their 4-H projects, Julie joined the Spring Creek 4-H Club when she was nine years old. She took part in a wide variety of projects over the years including several livestock projects.

She continues today to be an asset to the 4-H Program through her many hours spent before, during and after the 4-H/FFA Livestock Auction balancing books, collecting from buyers as well as creating checks and sale sheets for 4-H'ers.

Anyone could make nominations in each of the four counties and the final selections were made by Dill's family members from those nominations. The Chase County 2008 "Tom Dill Spirit of 4-H Award" recipient was Sabrina Hayes. Maggie, Tom's widow, presented this award.

Each year, a Sportsmanship Award is presented to a shooting sports member who exhibits responsibility, displays courtesy for others and demonstrates safety practices in the air rifle practices and competition. This trophy is sponsored by Burton and Vickie Beard in memory of
