Pastor Roger Doyle is in the process of moving furniture and decorating the walls of his new office at Berean Fundamental Church.

Since beginning his duties at the church a month ago, he's been moving the office from off the sanctuary to a new location near the front doors.

He and wife Diane have also been getting used to the quiet of a small town.

Pastor Doyle grew up in Bakersfield, Calif. He started assisting his minister father in 1981. "After I started I realized I was pretty young. About 1994 I realized I needed to get a formal education."

He received his Masters in Biblical Counseling from Andersonville Theological Seminary in Georgia in 2000. At that time he was pastor of Bridgebuilders Church in Meridian, Miss., where he ministered for 16 years.

Last year he returned to Bakersfield and was a hospice counselor before being hired by the Imperial church.
