



Deb Fischer is seeking the Republican nomination in the Nebraska U.S. Senate race, and was in Imperial Sunday where she met a number of area residents. Fischer, who bills herself as a conservative leader, also cites her experience as a wife, mother, rancher, small business owner and school board member in seeking next week’s Republican nomination.
