Chrome and polished paint sparkled in the sun at Saturday afternoon's ninth annual motorcycle show at the Chase County Fair.

Thirty-five bikes were lined up on the fairgrounds' main entryway for casual viewing by people at the fair. Thirty of them competed in various categories for awards.

People choosing to stop and cast their votes selected a "People's Choice" winner again this year.

Their choice was the aqua blue 1946 Harley-Davidson FL Knucklehead brought to the show by Gene and Sue Witte of Cambridge. That bike also won the Best Pre-1970 division.

Serving as judges were Bill White of Champion, Tim Pedersen of Kearney and Leonard Chubb of Crawford, who is ABATE's District 3 representative in Nebraska and a national rep to the Motorcycle Rights Foundation.

This year's 35 bikes in the show topped last year's 29. It was hosted and coordinated by members of ABATE District 12. Weiss Chiropractic of Imperial provided additional sponsorship.
