

Housing issues are heard loud and clear in our rural communities. Whether it is nuisance properties, lack of rentals, absentee ownership or lack of room for development, the list goes on and on.

The South Central Economic Development District (SCEDD) is partnering with the South Platte Chamber of Commerce (SPUCC) and the Nebraska Development Region-Central Region to put forth ideas on the problems.

A panel of three experts will showcase their solutions to housing issues.

The panel discussion will be on Tuesday, Nov. 13, at Taste of Texas, 302 East Ave, in Holdrege. The meeting kicks off at 5:30 p.m. CT, the meal will be served at 6:45, and the meeting will conclude at 8:30 p.m. Housing resource providers will be present to provide information and a brief summary of their programs.
