With 90 members, the Imperial Chamber of Commerce is a vital force in Imperial. The Chamber supports the economic growth of the town, the businesses and the community spirit.

President Jana Pribbeno said the Chamber would like to provide one family fun event every year.

The Chamber has sponsored the Harlem Ambassadors' basketball games, a bull riding contest, monthly promotions, Popcorn Days, the Ag Tech Fair and researched new housing opportunities in Imperial.

It also sponsors two scholarships each year for Chase County Schools graduating seniors.

Upcoming events include a Thanksgiving dinner basket drawing on Nov. 16, the Shop at Home campaign, which runs through Dec. 21, and a Christmas Festival Dec. 6.

Committees include Christmas Lighting, Promotions, Welcome Sign Project, Scholarship, Fair Parade, Housing, Economic Development, Membership, Ag Tech Fair and Chamber Calling.
