The award for best electric car went to the Chase County Schools' 2012-2013 Power Drive Team.

Award for the best interior went to Larry Hilty of Sterling, Colo., for his 1939 Chevrolet Coupe. Best engine award was given to Jason Krayra of Goodland, Kan., for his 1923 Ford T-Bucket.

The award for best paint went to Gary Johnson of Oshkosh for his 1970 Ford Mustang Mach 1. Show registrants were entered into a drawing for a 40-inch TV. Joe West of Arvada, Colo.,

who entered a 1966 Ford Galaxie in the show, was the proud winner of the TV.

All show entrants received a t-shirt and drew a magnetic koozie with a number on it for a door prize. All entrants and the public were invited to participate in the Valve cover races.
