Demolition derby fans got treated to plenty of smashups, rear enders, and head-ons during this year's Chase County Fair Imperial Jaycees demo derby held Thursday night of fair week, Aug. 15.

This year's event marked the 25th annual derby held by the Jaycees and fans were treated to a derby worthy of a celebration.

The no-weld class drew a total of 17 cars, allowing for three preliminary heats before the main event.

The main event featured nine cars in what many fans considered the best heat they'd seen at the derby in recent years.

Mike Stadler of Beaver City took the second place prize in the division.

As part of the incentive for drivers to be aggressive, the Jaycees add a \$250 prize in the no-weld and weld divisions.

Known as the "Mad Dog," the prize goes to the driver who is aggressive by hitting other cars, along with dishing out the hardest hit.

In the no-weld division, Karith Williams won the prize. Chad Cochran of Imperial won the prize in the weld division.
