While in Omaha he filled in at area churches for pastors on vacation or absent due to illness. Clay said he was led to ministry because of "God opening my eyes to the hope that is in Jesus" and making that hope known to people.

As pastor at Imperial Bible Church, his goal is "To help people understand the Gospel better, and they might grow into Christ-likeness and become disciples as well and share the good news."

Clay and wife Amanda have four children. He said spending time with his family is very important to him, and to "Explore life with them. I want them to explore the world and life and people" and all the things God has made.
