

Dundy County/Stratton game rescheduled for early January

With no organized practices since late last week, the Lady Longhorn basketball team will head into the first round of a three-day holiday tournament tonight (Thursday).

Because of the five-day moratorium mandated by the Nebraska School Activities Association, schools could not have practices or their gyms open from Dec. 22-26.

This is the first year for Chase County's participation in the Cabela's Holiday Basketball Shootout Tournament in Sidney, and the Lady Longhorns' first opponent will be Douglas, Wyo.

On Monday, Coach Nancy Sorensen said she hasn't been able to learn much about the team they will play Thursday at 2 p.m. in the middle school.

Win or lose, the Lady Longhorns will play at 2 p.m. Friday against either Hershey, 5-1, or Gering, 4-4.

Coach Sorensen said several players were dealing with illness last week, but she's hopeful they will be ready to go for Thursday's game.

Two players, MaKenna Ketter and Emma Bauerle, remain out with injuries. Ketter is possible for a return to action in early January, she said.
