



Girls go 1-2 in first appearance at Cabela's Holiday Shootout

Lady Longhorn Coach Nancy Sorensen said Chase County's first appearance at the Holiday Basketball Shootout in Sidney last weekend offered some good, tough competition for her team.

But that has come to be expected with Chase County's basketball schedule, which starts strong against competitive teams in early December and doesn't let up.

The girls finished 1-2 at the three-day event last Thursday, Friday and Saturday. They defeated Denver Love Christian Saturday, after losing to Douglas, Wyo., in the opening and to Gering on Friday.

Coach Sorensen said she liked the fact they faced several teams, for the most part, they don't see on a regular basis during the season.

This was Chase County's first year at this tournament, after playing in the Perkins County Holiday Tourney the past few years.

Douglas, Wyo., was the tournament champion on the girls' side, defeating Sidney 52-31 in the finals.

Chase County lost to a fast-paced team from Douglas in their opener last Thursday, 65-21.

Coach Sorensen said Douglas, now 10-0, put on a full court press early, forcing a lot of turnovers from the Lady Longhorns.

Chase County was held to just two points in the first quarter, and continued with just single digits on offense in the other three.

Douglas' offense was helped with six treys, compared to just one from Chase County from Morgan Fisher. The Wyoming team also capitalized on free throws, hitting 15 of 26 (58 percent). The Lady Longhorns weren't at the line much, hitting just two of six.

From two-point range, Chase County shot eight of 26 (31 percent), while Douglas was 16 of 28 (57 percent).

Kaycee Bubak and Jodi Koellner led Chase County's scoring with four each. Fisher was credited with three assists and two steals, Kelsey Wood had two steals, while Koellner scored a pair of blocked shots.

Douglas' post player Kassidy Scott led all scorers with 21 points, all but four coming in the first half.

Sorensen said she "was a player" who could hit inside and out.

Gering game

After their loss to Hershey, Gering moved into the consolation bracket Friday to face Chase County, when the Lady Longhorns came up on the short end of the 48-29 game.

Class B Gering used a full court man press against Chase County, again forcing too many turnovers (31), Sorensen said.

The coach noted the disparity again at the free throw line, where her team hit six of 15 (40 percent) while Gering dropped in 19 of 29 (66 percent).

Fouls also haunted Chase County's offense, with Bethany Sorensen and Kaycee Bubak both fouling out. Early fouls on Sorensen kept her out of about half the game.

Chase County had a spark in the offense at the end of the second quarter when Fisher hit a trey, pulling the team within four at the half.

Bubak led the scoring with 10, while Fisher added six.

Chase County hit 10 of 32 from two-point range (31 percent) Gering was 13 of 37 (35 percent). Both teams hit one three-pointer.

Bubak had five rebounds, Fisher three steals and Sorensen two assists in the game.
