A big win in the opener of the SPVA conference tournament set the Chase County Lady Longhorns on pace to finish a place higher than seeded.

In the last two years, the girls have placed one spot higher than the year before, from sixth place in 2011, fifth last year and fourth in this year's tourney that concluded Saturday in North Platte.

While they lost their Friday and Saturday games, Chase County's overtime win against Perkins County Jan. 15 set them on track to finish higher than their No. 5 seed.

Coach Nancy Sorensen said her team worked hard the entire tournament, and gave them credit for continuing to fight hard and finish fourth, even when trailing in the Friday and Saturday games.

After a three-game series last week, the 4-14 Lady Longhorns will have a full week off before traveling to Haxtun, Colo., Saturday for a full day of basketball.

Haxtun has just one gym, so games will start at 1 p.m. (an hour earlier than the schedule states), due to addition of a boys' C game at 1 p.m.

That will be followed by JV girls, JV boys, varsity girls and varsity boys action.

On Monday, Perkins County will be here for a 9-10 game at 5:30 p.m., then the JV and varsity teams travel to Wray, Colo., on Tuesday for girls' and boys' games starting at 4 p.m.

### **Perkins County**

Chase County's best shooting of the SPVA tournament came in their 37-36 overtime win last Tuesday against Perkins County in their first tournament game.

Strong field goal shooting at the end of the game, despite a lot of missed free throws in overtime, helped Chase County hold onto a one-point victory.

That was the difference from the two teams' first meeting on Jan. 10, when the Lady Plainsmen won by four.

Chase County led at the half in both games, but their scoring fell off in the second half of the earlier contest.

"It was nice to be ahead at half and hold on for the win" this time, Sorensen said. "It's a good thing we didn't need the free throws in overtime."

It wouldn't have been much of an overtime contest if they had. Perkins County was forced to foul, but Chase County had trouble connecting in the four-minute O.T., hitting three of 11 from the line. Paige Spady hit the only field goal in the overtime period.

"We stepped up when we needed to," Sorensen said.

Chase County was 13 of 47 (28 percent) from two-point range, while the Lady Plainsmen hit nine of 46 (20 percent).

On free throws, Chase County hit eight of 17 (47 percent) as Perkins County was 12 of 20 (60

percent). Perkins County had a 2-1 edge on treys.

Bethany Sorensen led all scorers in the game with 14. Spady added seven while Valeria Cervantes and Bridget Langin each had five.

Sorensen was also credited with four steals, while Spady and Kaycee Bubak each pulled down six rebounds.

Hershey advanced to Saturday night's finals, where they defeated No. 2 seed North Platte St. Pat's 44-30 for the conference title.
