Sophomore Freddie Kasselmann paced the Longhorn varsity golfers in their opening meet at Bayard April 2.

Kasselmann put together rounds of 40 on the front side followed by a 42 on the back side of the nine-hole course to finish third with an 82.

He was just five strokes out of the first place score of 77 shot by Trae Blanco of Bayard.

Coach Larry Munger said his team struggled with consistency and penalty strokes. They just need to build some confidence.

Sophomore Ryan Moline finished with a 94 on rounds of 48-46. He was the only other golfer to keep in double digits as the team finished fourth with a 395 total.
