Coach Larry Munger said four tournaments have been rescheduled due to weather.

The Longhorns held their invitational April 13 in less than ideal weather conditions but did manage to get the tournament in. That's been the last tournament they've played in.

Munger said not only have they missed tournaments but they've missed valuable practice time as well.
