Both of Chase County's seventh and eighth grade girls' track teams took the championship in last Thursday's home meet at the CCS track.

The two teams combined for eight first place finishes to win both divisions.

It was also a larger meet than usual after A.D. Troy Hauxwell consented to requests to compete here from four other schools who had not had meets yet this season due to the weather.

More than 100 youths were entered in several of the events, requiring them to be run as finals against time and distance.

However, the meet concluded about 4:30 p.m., a little over an hour longer than normal.

Temperatures proved perfect for the meet with a little wind.

Scoring in the seventh grade girls' division was Chase Co. 93, Dundy Co./Stratton 82, Wray 82, Hershey 78.5, Hitchcock Co. 51.5, Wauneta-Palisade 51, Sutherland 40, Perkins Co. 37, North Platte St. Patrick's 34, Holyoke 20, Garden Co. 5, and Medicine Valley 5.
