



This year's Masters golf tournament in Augusta, Ga., proved to be a memorable one with Angel Cabrera of Argentina defeating Kenny Perry of the U.S. in a playoff that ended on the second extra hole. Undoubtedly, one of the most famous sequence of holes at the Masters, and perhaps all of golf, is Amen Corner. Spectators can view the 11th green, the 12th hole and the 13th tee box all from a seat at Amen Corner.



Former Masters champion Vijay Singh honed his skills on the practice green during the final practice round Wednesday. Singh made the cut and finished in a tie for 30th with a score of -1 for the 72 holes. Singh's best round was a 2-under 70 on Friday.
