With SPVA Conference and district championships in the history book for 2013, Chase County's boys' track team is looking to match that or even improve this season.

Head Coach Carl Zuege said those championships and the fact eight of nine 2013 state qualifiers returned this season indicate another good year.

"But, we still need to put in the work," he said.

And, so far, he and the other track coaches like what they've seen.

That's important as the first meet arrives this Saturday in Cambridge.

"It seems the kids are working harder than last year. I'm impressed with their workouts and enthusiasm," Zuege said.

With 36 on the boys' roster, that's a big plus, too. Zuege believes that's the highest number out since he's been at CCS.

"Our kids want to be out," he said. He credits a strong junior high program and "awesome facilities" for that.

When asked about conditioning, Zuege said he never feels the team is in shape for the first meet. He worries most about the mid and long distance runners, but six to eight who weren't out for winter sports ran regularly in between seasons, he said.

The first meet Saturday will tell them where they are with conditioning, he added.

The experience back this year tops the list of team strengths, Zuege said. Two of those returning state qualifiers, Kevin German (300 m. hurdles) Justus Wallin (shot) were state medalists in 2013. Wallin also competed in the discus at state.

Other state qualifiers back include Shay Eidson, triple jump; German and Kelton Fisher, high hurdles; Holden Dreiling, 1600; and three of the four 1600 meter relay team members—Dan Sullivan, David Almanza and German. Trey Milner was an alternate last year on that relay and will be up to replace Kale Gockley, who graduated.

Zuege also said the team will be strong in its mid and long distances.

Besides Eidson who will be expected to score points again this season, Zuege said the team's other jumpers show some promise.

They'll still be looking for athletes to step up in the sprints. Trey Milner is expected to score in that area.

This year, Perkins County will host the SPVA meet on Friday, May 2. Chase County should be a strong favorite to repeat that championship, Zuege said, but Kimball, who joined the conference last fall, will add an unknown.

The Longhorns will have to make a longer trip than Grant for districts this spring. Bayard is the C-11 district meet host on Thursday, May 15.

Chase County will host its home meet on Tuesday, April 22.
