If you name it, Greg and Rebecca Koellner of Koellner Enterprises probably does it if it involves concrete or dirt work. The couple established their company on a part-time basis in August, 2001, then went full time in March of 2004.

The business is located in the "old bus barn," formerly owned by the school district, at 1005 Park Street.

Koellner Enterprises demolishes and replaces old concrete, pours concrete foundations and flatwork, slipforms concrete and builds feed bunks, sidewalks and more.

Employees, which include Chad Tuell, Eric Barnard, Joe Humphrey, Travis Rotter, Matt Howard and Calvin Rutherford, also do dirt work, farm site cleanup, building demolition, and sell and haul fill dirt, mag and topsoil.

Koellner said a unique aspect of his business is that it is the only one around that has a slipform machine that can slipform many varieties of concrete.

Winter hours are usually 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. depending upon the weather. Summer hours stretch from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
