In an effort to coordinate the dropping off of students at Chase County Schools in the morning, crossing guard Bonnie Weiss has begun directing traffic in the a.m.

The Health and Safety Committee decided to add the morning crossing guard "due to the number of parents that drop their kids off in the street, and the people who go too fast in the mornings," according to Nurse Angie Paisley, a member of the committee.
