Out of 31 entries from Chase County Schools, 20 earned superiors, or “I” ratings, at Friday’s District 5 music contest.

CCS hosted the contest for a second year in a row, giving students not involved in the high school music programs here a day off from classes.

The CCS teaching staff and administration were at school during the day, however, and helped with introductions, watching doors and assisting the judges.

Randy Hayes, 7-12 vocal director at CCS, coordinated the contest again this year and said the school received “a lot of good comments” on the day from directors at the other schools in District 5.

While they had some computer issues prior to the contest with scheduling, Hayes said the day of the contest ran smoothly.

This year, the band performances started at 7:30 a.m. to get a little earlier start, Hayes said. Choirs started their performances at 8 a.m.

The two bands playing between 7:30 and 8 a.m., McCook and Medicine Valley, are both on central time zone, so it didn’t mean such an early departure for them, Hayes noted.

“That helped open up the schedule and it worked really well,” Hayes said.

Three judges rated the large group performances such as bands and choruses. One judge was stationed at all of the small group and solo entries.

Judges for the vocal/piano numbers were Dennis Hutchinson, Smith Center, Kan.; Glenda Baker, Cambridge; and Jerrilee Shuman and Philip Shuman, both of Colby, Kan.

Serving as judges for the instrumental entries were Sarah Romero, Wray, Colo.; Jeff Jordan and Lane Weaver, Hays, Kan.; and Gary Hall of Loveland, Colo.

At districts, if a school’s chorus, show choir, concert band or jazz band entry earned a superior from all three judges, the group received an NSAA district plaque.

CCS groups earning that plaque were the 9th St. Singers and the chorus.

This was the 17th consecutive year the 9th St. Singers have received the NSAA district plaque, which means 51 consecutive superior ratings.

It was the seventh consecutive year the CCS chorus has received the district plaque at districts, or 21 consecutive superior ratings.

Other schools at the contest here last week were Arapahoe, Cambridge, Dundy County/Stratton, Eustis-Farnam, Hayes Center, Hitchcock County, Maywood, McCook, Medicine Valley, Southwest and Wauneta/Palisade.

CCS chorus—Received super-iors from all three judges, so received an NSAA plaque.
